First developed in 2013 by students.


Has featured native species including cone flower and golden rod.

Relearn our Land Garden




Located on one of the Posvar Hall patios.

Features species with significance to Indigenous peoples.


Posvar Pollinator Garden on Clemente

Posvar Pollinator Garden on Schenley




Located near Schenley Drive and Clemente Drive on the side of Posvar Hall.
